### NGA

#### **Notice of Grant Award**

Legally binding document that

- 1.notifies the grantee and others that an award has been made
- 2. Contains or references all terms and conditions of the award
- 3.Documents the obligation of funds



### CFR

#### Code of Federal Regulations

An annually revised codification of the general and permanent rules published in the Federal Register.



### MOU

#### Memorandum of Understanding

A document describing a bilateral or multilateral agreement between parties.



### MTA

#### **Material Transfer Agreement**

A legal document defining the conditions under which research or other materials can be transferred and used among research laboratories.



### RCR

#### Responsible Conduct of Research

Training and oversight in the responsible and ethical conduct of research to undergraduates, graduate students, and postdoctoral researchers.



### PO

#### **Program Officer**

Official responsible for the programmatic, scientific, and/or technical aspects of a grant.



### PI

#### Principal Investigator

An individual designated by the grantee to direct the project or activity being supported by the grant. He or she is responsible and accountable to the grantee and agency for the proper conduct of the project or activity.

Also know as Program Director or Project Director.



### SRO

#### Sponsored Research Office

Office located either centrally or departmentally, that assists in the review and submission of applications for external funding.



# CO Contracting Officer

Government employee authorized to execute contractual agreements on behalf of the government.



### COTR

#### Contract Officer Technical Representative

A business communications liaison between the United States government and a private contractor to ensure their goals are mutually beneficial.



### RFA

#### Request for Applications

A formal statement that invites grant or cooperative agreement applications in a well-defined scientific area to accomplish specific program objectives.



### BAA

#### **Broad Agency Announcement**

A competitive solicitation procedure used to obtain proposals for basic and applied research and that part of development not related to the development of a specific system or hardware procurement.



### CCR

#### Central Contractor Registration Database

The main vendor database for the U.S. Federal Government.



### **CSR**

#### Center for Scientific Review

The NIH component responsible for the receipt and referral of applications to the PHS, as well as the initial review for scientific merit of most applications submitted to the NIH.



### **CFDA**

#### Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance

A government-wide compendium of Federal programs, projects, services, and activities which provide assistance or benefits to the American public.



### GMO

#### Grants Management Officer

Official responsible for the business management aspects of grants and cooperative agreements, including review, negotiation, award, and administration, and for the interpretation of grants administration policies and provisions.



### FASAB

#### Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board

A U.S. federal advisory committee whose mission is to develop generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) for federal financial reporting entities.



### FFATA

## Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act

Signed on September 26, 2006, the intent is to empower every American with the ability to hold the government accountable for each spending decision. The end result is to reduce wasteful spending in the government.



### ASAP

## Automated Standard Application for Payments

Electronic system that allows grantee organizations receiving federal funds to draw from accounts pre-authorized by federal agencies.



### HIPAA

## Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act

Law from 1996 that amends the Internal Revenue Code to improve portability of health insurance coverage, promote medical savings accounts, improve access to long-term care services and coverage, and simplify administration of heal insurance.



# Direct Costs

Costs that can be specifically identified with a particular project or activity.



### IDC

#### **Indirect Cost**

Costs that are incurred by a grantee for common or joint objectives and cannot be indentified specifically with a particular project or program. Also known as Facilities and Administrative Costs.



### FY

#### Fiscal Year

The annual period established for Government accounting purposes. The Federal Fiscal Year begins October 1 and ends September 30 of the following year.



### CBO

#### Congressional Budget Office

Primary congressional agency charged with reviewing congressional budgets and other legislative initiatives with budgetary implications.



#### CASB

#### Cost Accounting Standards Board

CASB is an independent statutorily-established Board consisting of five members who have the exclusive authority to make, promulgate, and amend cost accounting standards and interpretations designed to achieve uniformity and consistency in the cost accounting practices governing the measurement, assignment, and allocation of costs to contracts within the United States.

### GSA

#### **General Services Administration**

An independent agency of the United States government, established in 1949 to help manage and support the basic functioning of federal agencies.



### **IBC**

#### Institutional Biosafety Committee

Committee charged by Federal law with the planning and implementation of the campus Biosafety Program with a purpose to ensure the health and safety of all personnel working with biohazardous agents.



### AAU

#### **Association of American Universities**

A nonprofit association of 61 U.S. and two Canadian preeminent public and private research universities.



### MBE

#### Minority Business Enterprise

A business which is at least 51% owned, operated and controlled on a daily basis by one or more (in combination) American citizens of the following ethnic minority classifications:

- 1.African American
- 2. Asian American (includes West Asian Americans (India etc.) and East Asian Americans (Japan Korea etc.))
- 3. Hispanic American not of the Iberian peninsula
- 4. Native American including Aleuts



### PTO

#### Patent and Trademark Office

The Federal agency for granting U.S. patents and registering tademarks.



### DHHS

#### Department of Health & Human Services

The United States government's principal agency for protecting the health of all Americans and providing essential human services, especially for those who are least able to help themselves.



## ARO

#### Army Research Office

The Army's premier extramural basic research agency in the engineering, physical, information and life sciences; developing and exploiting innovative advances to insure the Nation's technological superiority. Basic research proposals from educational institutions, nonprofit organizations, and private industry are competitively selected and funded.



## AFOSR

#### Air Force Office of Scientific Research

AFOSR manages the basic research investment for the U.S. Air Force.

AFOSR's technical experts foster and fund research within the Air Force

Research Laboratory, universities and industry laboratories to ensure the transition of research results to support USAF needs.



## DARPA

#### Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency

DARPA's mission is to maintain the technological superiority of the U.S. military and prevent technological surprise from harming our national security by sponsoring revolutionary, high-payoff research bridging the gap between fundamental discoveries and their military use.



## DTRA

#### Defense Threat Recognition Agency

DTRA is the U.S. Department of Defense's official Combat Support Agency for countering weapons of mass destruction.



## FAR

#### Federal Acquisition Regulations

The primary document, and agency acquisition regulations that implement or supplement the Federal Acquisition Regulations System, which was established for the codification and publication of uniform policies and procedures for acquisition by all executive agencies.



## DFAR

#### Defense Federal Acquisition Regulations

The DFARS are the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulations Supplement, a supplement to the FAR that provides DoD specific acquisition regulations.



## DEAR

#### Department of Energy Acquisition Regulations

Uniform acquisition policies from the Department of Energy which implement and supplement the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) (Chapter 1 of Title 48 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)).



## EDGAR

## Education Department General Acquisition Regulations

Parts 74-99 of the Code of Federal Regulations are collectively known as the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR). These parts contain regulations for administering discretionary and formula grants awarded by the Department of Education.



## DODGARS

#### **DOD** Grant and Agreement Regulations

Department-wide policies and procedures for the award and administration of DoD grants and agreements.



## EO

#### **Executive Order**

An order issued by the President, the head of the executive branch of the federal government. Executive orders are usually issued to guide officers and agencies of the Executive branch in managing the operations within the Federal Government itself.



## EFT

#### **Electronic Funds Transfer**

A safe, secure, efficient, and less expensive electronic alternative to paper check payments and collections often used by the Federal government.



## IP

#### Intellectual Property

Refers to a number of distinct types of creations of the mind for which a set of exclusive rights are recognized – and the corresponding fields of law.



## SF

#### Standard Form

Forms for reporting on federal grants and cooperative agreements, provided by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB).



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## PMS

#### Payment Management System

Automated system for the delivery and tracking of funds which the HHS Division of Payment Management (DPM) operated. Grant payments to non-Federal grantee institutions are made available through PMS.



## DCAA

#### **Defense Contract Audit Agency**

The DCAA, while serving the public interest as its primary customer, shall perform all necessary contract audits for the Department of Defense and provide accounting and financial advisory services regarding contracts and subcontracts to all DoD Components responsible for procurement and contract administration.



## DNDO

#### **Domestic Nuclear Detection Office**

A jointly staffed agency within the Department of Homeland Security. It is the primary entity in the U.S. government for implementing domestic nuclear detection efforts for a managed and coordinated response to radiological and nuclear threats, as well as integration of federal nuclear forensics programs.

Additionally, DNDO is charged with coordinating the development of the global nuclear detection and reporting architecture, with partners from federal, state, local, and international governments and the private sector.



## AFARS

#### Army Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement

The Army Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (AFARS) implements and supplements the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), the Defense FAR Supplement (DFARS) and the DFARS Procedures, Guidance and Information (PGI) to establish uniform policies for Army acquisition.



## FFRDC

# Federally Funded Research and Development Center

An FFRDC meets some special long-term research or development need which cannot be met as effectively by existing in-house or contractor resources. FFRDC's enable agencies to use private sector resources to accomplish tasks that are integral to the mission and operation of the sponsoring agency.



## ITAR

#### International Traffic in Arms Regulations

A set of United States government regulations that control the export and import of defense-related articles and services on the United States Munitions List. These regulations implement the provisions of the Arms Export Control Act (AECA), and are described in Title 22 (Foreign Relations), Chapter I (Department of State), Subchapter M of the Code of Federal Regulations.
